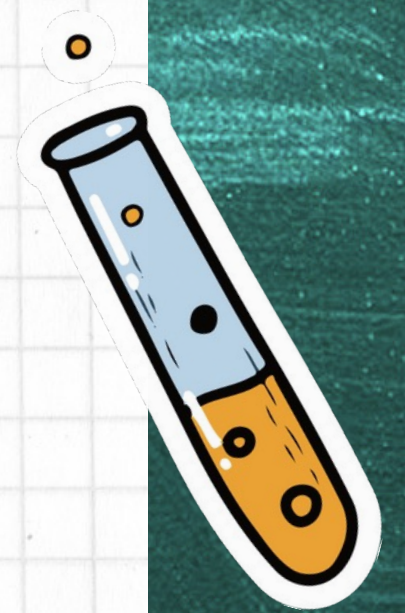





Specially Designed for your child's Hifdh Journey

- They will catch up



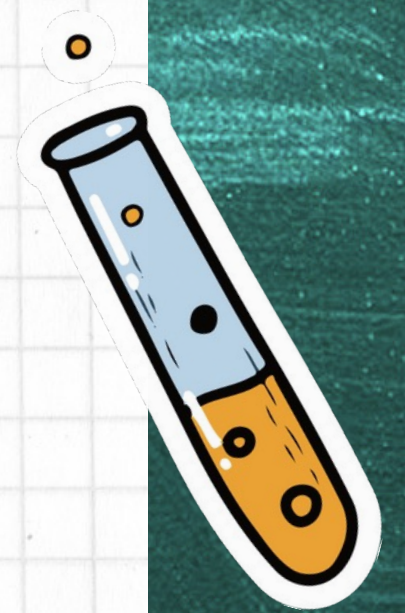


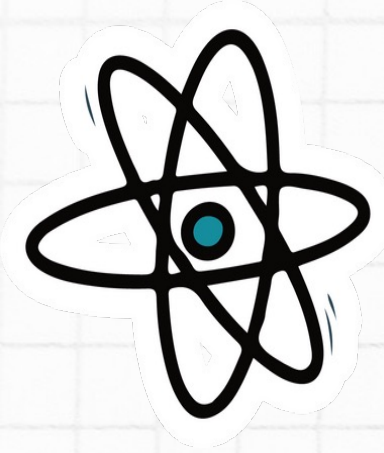


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The “Traditional Classroom” or “Co-op” Approach

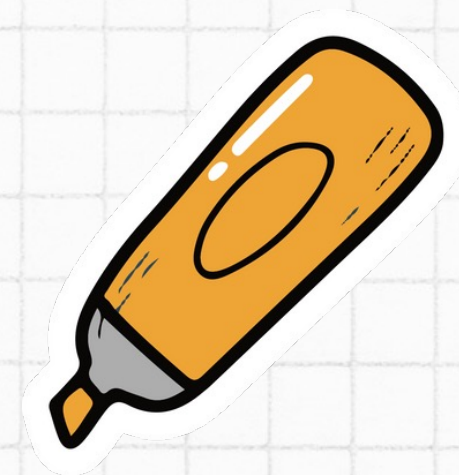
Pros:

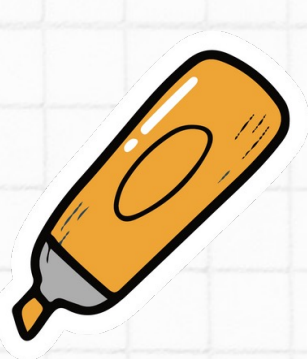
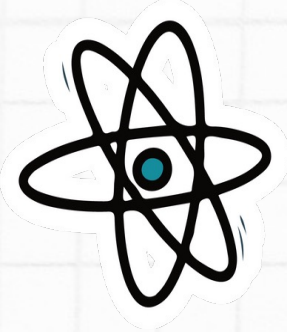
- Structured environment with a consistent schedule.
- Direct teacher-led instruction and immediate feedback.
- Promotes group learning and peer interaction.



Cons:

- Rigid pacing may overwhelm students, especially those balancing Hifz.
- Less flexibility to accommodate individual learning speeds and needs.
- Can lead to stress or frustration if students fall behind.





The “1:1 Tutoring Model” Approach

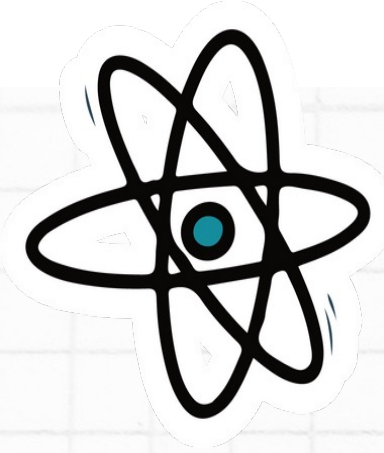
Pros:

- Personalized, one-on-one attention tailored to the student's specific needs.
- Flexible scheduling to fit around other commitments.
- Focused on individual problem areas, leading to targeted improvement.
- Access to a broad range of tutors with virtual tutoring and affordable

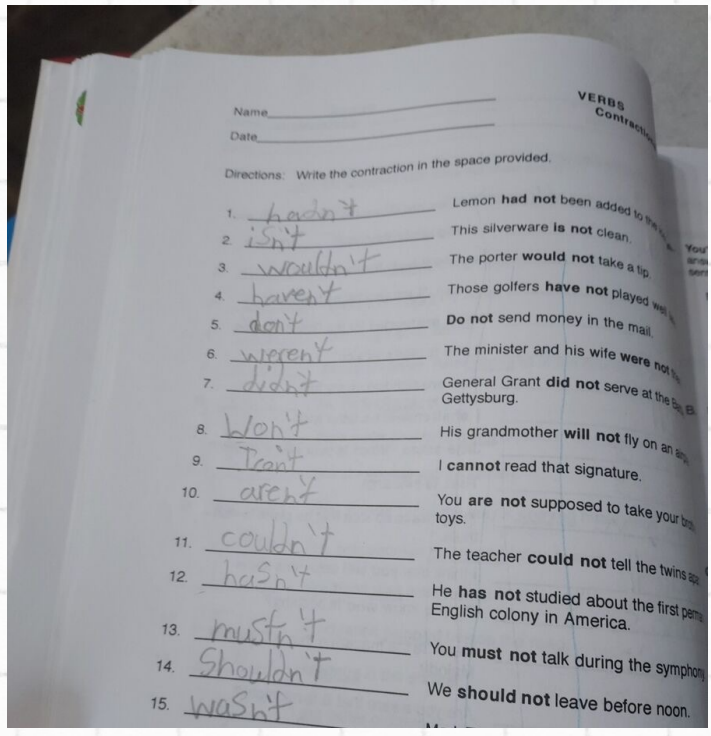


Cons:

- Can be isolating, with less peer interaction and collaboration.
- May lack the structure of a classroom, relying heavily on student motivation.
- In-person is more expensive and resource-intensive.
- Virtual tutoring can suffer from technical issues and requires more self-discipline



The “Study Hall” Hybrid Approach



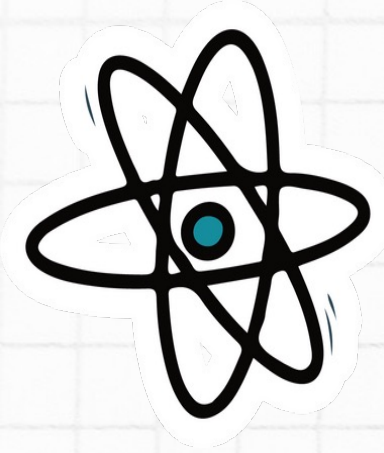
Students come in and work on their assigned number of pages in their curriculum. These are specific curriculums that lend themselves to self-paced work.



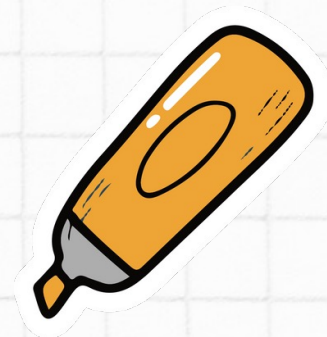
If they have any questions or need help, they receive 1:1 attention from the teacher. If several students have the same question, the teacher will work with them together

Monthly: Students are assessed, progress is reported to parents and lesson plans are adjusted.



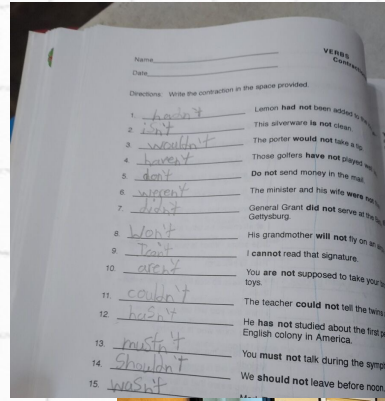


The “Study Hall” Hybrid Approach



Pros:

- Flexibility to work at one’s own pace, reducing stress and pressure.
- Personalized support from a teacher when needed
- Fosters independence by allowing students to take ownership of their learning.
- Group setting “study hall” provides positive “peer pressure” and focus.
- Cost-effective approach



Cons:

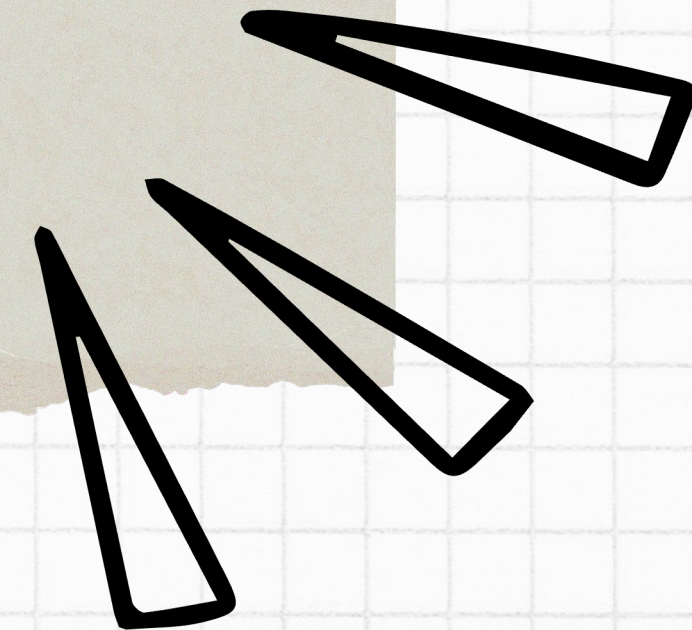
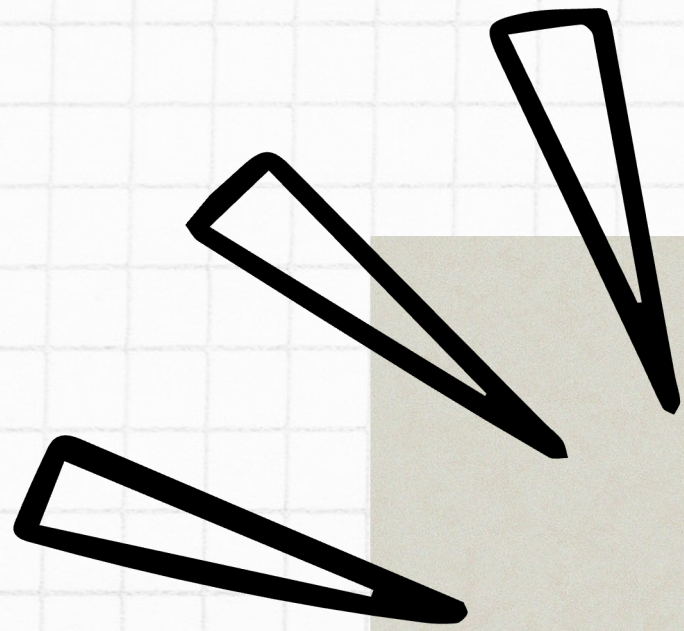
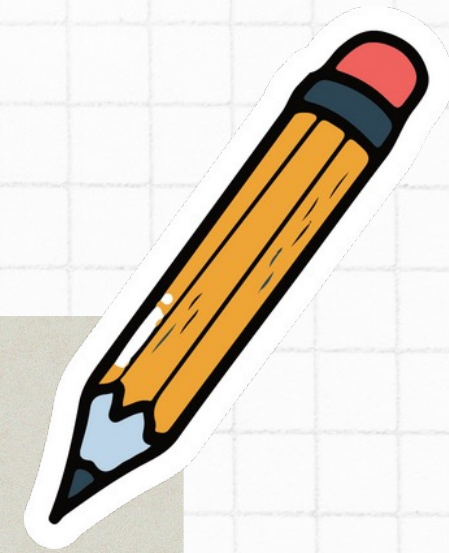
- Less direct, ongoing supervision compared to a traditional classroom or a co-op
- Needs regular monitoring to ensure students stay on track.
- Specific types of curriculums work with this approach thereby limiting your options

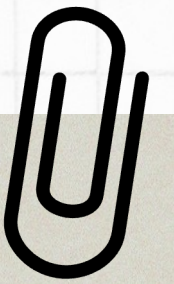
Mudassarrah Chaudhry
